While touring the country in a small bus and truck production of Gentlemen Prefer Blondes, Tim was fascinated by the ghost stories and legends told by local stagehands at different vaudeville and touring houses each night. Upon moving back to New York City when the tour ended, he started to explore the history and legends that have taken place in our current 41 Broadway theaters. Unearthing some truly fantastic stories from over 100 years ago, Tim felt compelled to start a walking tour of the Broadway Theatre District further detailing and sharing those ghost stories, anecdotes and wonderful tales with the theatre lovers who journey to New York City to take in a show.











Add to those stories the sharing of the inner workings of the life of an actor, stage manager or other theatre professional and you have a comprehensive tour that changes the way the general public experiences a Broadway show. Never again will the theatregoer set foot in a theater without thinking about how those walls and velvet seats have housed so many earlier legendary memories, and they will realize that they are now personally linked to that individual theater's legacy.






